Meals*: Cook over the fire (Shady Glen Unit) or in your kitchen (Program Center Upper/Lower)

Suggested itinerary:

Friday Night

- After school drive to Camp Singing Hills (1 to 1.5hr drive south of the Metro area)
- Eat dinner on the way- bring bag lunches or stop for quick dinner
- Spend the night at Camp in your cabin

Saturday Morning

• Wake up in your cabin to the sounds of nature – or your early riser scouts!

Saturday Daytime

Option A

- Spend the day at Camp as a troop
- Work on Outdoor skill badges*, go hiking at camp, relax in your hammocks in the hammock weaver, observe nature at camp- deer, birds, and turtles by the lake. Listen to the sound of the wind and birds in the trees- enjoy not hearing cars, trucks, boat engines or city sounds. The only sounds you will hear are from nature- and the laughter and cheers of your fellow Girl Scouts!

Option B

- Troop Art Exploration time
- GSUSA is releasing 2 new Art based/focused Junior badges that your troop could work on- "Craft and Tinker" and "Art and Design"
- <u>Visit Faribault Mills</u> and learn about weaving, take a behind the scenes tour of the mill to learn about the wool manufacturing process- from raw wool to finished blankets. Group tours available by appointment.
- Schedule a Private Art Party for your troop at "<u>Make it Waterville</u>." This woman-owned business offers Art Parties/ Classes ranging from: string art, quilting, jewelry, pottery, painting and silk screening.

• Sit out by the campfire and sing songs, roast marshmallows and watch the stars!

Sunday Morning

- Eat breakfast at Camp
- · Finish up any badge work/art projects

Sunday Afternoon

- Drive home with your troop
- Stop at <u>Scoops</u> for an ice cream cone or cup of coffee for the road
